The following is an article by R.: W: Gerard Sevin a member of both our Lodge and of the Grande Loge Nationale Française regarding the French National Assembly and the involvement of Freemasonry in French History.

L'ASSEMBLEE NATIONALE - THE FRENCH NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

The NATIONAL ASSEMBLY or French Parliament is made up of, in addition to the Bourbon Palace itself, of three separate buildings located around it. The men who occupy or previously occupied them, the architecture of the palace, are reminders of the links between Freemasonry and the lower house of Parliament.

The very first assembly, called Constituent Assembly, was established on June 17, 1789, one month after the meeting of the General Council, by the third Republic. The Constituent Assembly first occupied the palace of the Archbishop of Paris. It is in 1791 that the 745 deputies first met. On August 1, 1792, the end of the monarchy was voted. The National Convention succeeded the previous assembly. From May 9, 1793, the entity leaves the "Manège" for the Tuileries Palace and strives for the establishment of a republican constitution. It takes shape on June 24, 1793: Parliament is then master of power. Then came the Directory and, later, the overthrow of the Government by General Napoleon Bonaparte (November 9, 1799). Under the Restoration period follow the reign of Napoleon, the Chamber of Deputies (lower Chamber) took shape. Its representatives were elected for five-year terms.

From 1815, the Prince of Condé rents the Lassay Palace for a three-year lease. Originally, the Bourbon Palace was erected in 1722. Louise-Françoise de Bourbon yielded the place to the Marquis de Lassay, her lover. The construction of the Palace was completed in 1728.

Louis XV (also a Mason) took possession of the Palace, to carry out many improvements, under the direction of Augustin Pajou. The palace became "Property of the Nation" in 1791. The buildings were connected (including the Lassay Palace and the Bourbon Palace), a hemicycle is built, etc. The architect Bernard Poyet (from the famous Nine Sisters lodge) built a peristyle, consisting of twelve columns, at the top of a step of thirty steps. Poyet was protected by Lucien Bonaparte, himself a mason. Beginning in 1827, the state took full possession of the premises. It is the architect Jules de Joly (son of Etienne de Joly, official spokesperson for the Grand Orient) who oversaw the development. The first ceiling of the Peace Salon is the work of the painter Horace Vernet (also mason), who painted the "Salle des pas perdus" (The lost Steps room). Similarly, a little earlier, the foundation was built by Jean-Pierre Cortot (from the Grand Sphinx lodge), while the mason François Rude took care of the facade. The foundation conceals more or less two women wearing one square and the other a compass. As for the Palais Bourbon Square, the statue that adorns it features, in bas-relief, an "eye" of the Great Architect of the Universe, particularly eloquent.

Cahin-caha, France gave birth, under the Second Republic, the National Assembly, which is installed May 13, 1849. It is dissolved December 2, 1851, after the overthrowing of the President of the Republic, by Louis Napoleon Bonaparte. The Legislature is installed a year later. It was not until 1875 to see the resurrection of the National Assembly, which would be truly overshadowed only under the Vichy regime. Many founding texts - from the law of separation of Church and State to the introduction of abortion - will emanate from the Assembly

Today, in addition to the various the parliamentary groups that are separated by their political affinities, various parliamentary fraternities also exist. These fraternities bring together masons of the different Grand Lodges that exist in France. This "grouping" consists of more than 300 members, more than half of the elected members of the Assembly, and include members of the Senate, the European Parliament and the Economic and Social Council. They are instrumental in ensuring that a common ground is found when debating a new piece of legislation.

The Assembly, besides its architecture and its members, is thus deeply inscribed in the Parisian geography of Freemasonry. The importance of Freemasonry is deeply engraved not only in the stone that it is made of but also in the buildings that adorn and border it.
